Vote: 34 present, yes=22, no=1, abstained=4; motion passes

Motion 1 (Genie) Propose that attendees not use foul language in the For Today meeting shares.

Genie - Our message is for the newcomer. Other language can be used.

Second: Alice Discussion:

Alice – I attend other meetings that are addition meetings. I can only stay a little while because of the language. Our message is for the newcomer. Other language can be used.

Robin – As I grow older, I find the foul language unnecessary. I want it to be passed.

Karen - Do not hear violent profanity much. I do not think we should censor. We need to be careful of censorship. Not in favor of this.

Bill – What are the consequences? Is there a time out for a day? For a week?

Kate – We would not have consequences

Kim – Need to be careful of censorship. There is no way to enforce this motion.

Aubyn – Strongly concerned about newcomers being turned off by the language. Personally not offended anymore, but still feel uncomfortable when foul language is used a lot. If not passed, then add "Take what you like and leave the rest."

Gloria – Con because the newcomer might use the language too. I have not heard much. OA guidelines exist on disruptive behavior.

Vote: 36 present, yes=9, no=23, abstained=1; motion fails

Motion 2 (Wanda) Propose that we keep the GC meeting to an hour.

Wanda – wanted to take the temperature of the room. I know we can extend, but I get exhausted after an hour of meeting and an hour of GC. Could we extend to the next week.

Second: Kim Discussion:

Wanda – Could things be automatically extended to the next week?

Kim – This motion coming up might help with the time limit.

Bill – The auto-extend is another motion for another meeting

Gloria – Agree the last motion may help. Been to many meetings where it goes an hour and anything not voted is automatically tabled.

Karen – For the motion because I cannot stand to go for an hour.

Denise – What happens when there is an important issue? Do we wait a month?

Kate – Only seen meetings extended twice

Christy called to vote

Vote: 37 present, yes=11, no=12, abstained=8; motion fails

<u>Motion 3 (Kim P)</u> Motion votes stand for 6 months. Propose that website administrator would add section to website GC page "Prior motions' results for the last 6 months". Secretary would submit a tracking pdf to website administrator every month when minutes are submitted.

Second: Diana Discussion:

Kim – We have a tradition to have people participate. Committee to join an intergroup, as example, came up once, we found no support for it, but then it came up again. I volunteer to help update the website to have the motions

Ann – I agree with this.

Diana – I am in favor. There seem to be topics that we discuss every month.

Gloria – I am in favor. Why rehash the same thing? We can bring things up again, but give it some time. Like the 6 months, maybe longer

Denise – Great idea because people may not be here every month to see this.

KarenKay – Not a bad idea, however should update the GC call for motions to suggest they review the website.

Bill - call to vote

Vote: 37 present, yes=27, no=0, abstained=2 motion passes

<u>Motion 4 (Kim P)</u> Propose that discussion per motion limited to 4 pros, 4 cons. Indicate that you would like to discuss with thumbs up or thumbs down, chairperson would call on members in order until 4 and 4 are heard, then vote.

Second: Leeann
Discussion:

Kim – I like order. Unfair to the GC chair to have to limit when a lot of people vote. We would have the camera on to signal thumbs up or thumbs down.

Leeann – I agree. Could emojis be enabled for the meeting?

Jean – I agree generally speaking. Don't know if having your hand up first means you get to talk. Could the chairperson ask for anyone with a different perspective.

Gloria – Kate did some research on tradition 2 that after 2 pros/2 cons, GC chair could ask for different thoughts

Kate – Did some research. If 4 said the same things, chair can ask for different thoughts

Kim – Would Kate like to share?

Kate – I would be pro. The ones where people keep saying the same thing, but the 4 pro/con set makes it less personal

Denise – Some people will repeat the same things, but other people have completely changed my take.

Bill – I like Gloria's idea, but that is a proposal for another month

Jean – <I did not capture this. I asked if she could post in the chat, but she did not>

Karen – The way Kate has been doing a great job, but to have a set number would be good. But if some has a question, it may bring up more discuss.

Kim – Clarify to take the pressure off the chair. Also, I do not like "call for vote"

Ronna – Current way, this a very democratic way of doing it. If people hear what they want to say before they are called on, they should lower their hand before GC calls on them.

Vini – I think this avoids hurt feelings

Diana called to vote

Vote: 32 present, yes=26, no=0, abstained=2 motion passes
